The Springfield Township Trustees met in regular session, closed to the public, on Monday, April 20, 2020, at 7:00 p.m. in the Township Chambers, 7617 Angola Road, Holland, Ohio. After being sworn in, Mr. Barnes stated that the property owner wished to establish a concrete contractor supply house in an existing building on the lot. He indicated that the change was consistent with the neighboring parcels and had been approved by the Planning Commission, the Zoning Commission, and the staff. Mr. Marciniak, of 4755 King Road and the applicant representative, further stated that the proposed operation should create only a small amount of traffic. PUBLIC SAFETY:

Sheriff's Report: By Lt. Leach

Lt. Leach stated that his officers have been taking extra safety precautions during the pandemic but have not experienced any major staffing issues. He said that there has been an uptick in domestic violence calls, as well as complaints about park gatherings. The Trustees asked about recent comments by the County Commissioners regarding potential budget cuts. Lt. Leach stated that although he was not privy to the conversations, he assumed the Commissioners were discussing all options to eliminate the anticipated budget shortfall.

PUBLIC SAFETY (cont.):

Fire/EMS Report: By Barry Cousino, Fire Chief

Chief Cousino reviewed the Monthly Report and highlighted the following items:

- All scheduled Fire Department events, including Safety Town, have been cancelled/postponed. Reschedule dates will be discussed when the pandemic crisis has passed.
- Chief Cousino stated that 3 fire fighters have tested positive for COVID-19 and an additional 10 are in quarantine for either exposure or symptoms. He said that the department was coping well with the reduced staffing but the Township was doing much better than Toledo, who appear to be having the highest exposure rates.
- The Toledo area hospitals are currently operating with about 30% 40% of ventilator capacity.
- The department was able to utilize some protective masks that were in storage, despite the fact that the elastic had degraded. Chief Cousino thanked those individuals who volunteered both materials and time to make the repairs.
- Chief Cousino wanted to give special commendation to all the Fire Fighters who were performing well above basic expectations.
- Motion made by Andrew Glenn to designate the listed fire equipment as surplus and allow Chief Cousino to sell the items on govdeals.com, as presented. Seconded by Robert Bethel and the roll call resulted as follows:

• With Assistant Fire Chief, Rick Helminski retiring in the summer and the Department's service area continuing to expand (five separate communities with four physical fire stations), Chief Cousino asked to promote Dave Moore to Assistant Fire Chief and create a Battalion Chief position for each shift. He said that making the change at this time will allow sufficient training time with the prior position holder and ensure a smooth transition for the whole department. A formal induction ceremony will be held at a future date.

Motion made by Robert Bethel to appoint Dave Moore as Assistant Fire Chief, at a rate of \$41.50/hour, effective 4/27/2020. Seconded by Andrew Glenn and the roll call resulted as follows:
