#### **PUBLIC COMMENT:**

Lawrence Leon, of 313 Cheswick, spoke on behalf of the Lincoln Green area residents. He had several issues of concern, including cars parked across sidewalks and intersections, a resident running a business out of his home, upgrading the park, and the overgrowth of vegetation. The Trustees will look into addressing all of the issues and do what they can.

#### **PUBLIC SAFETY**:

Sheriff's Report:

Lt. Carter presented the Crime Report for July.

Ken Konoff, of 1837 Connecticut, spoke on how the neighborhood residents and their homes have been getting harassed by juveniles for the last five years. One of the juveniles was caught on tape during the act of harassment. Mr. Konoff wanted to know what is going to be done about the ongoing situation. He believes that Springfield Township needs to have their own police department. Lt. Carter stated the Sheriff's Office is well aware of the situation and they have been working on the situation. He recommends that the residents call every time there is an incident.

Mark Ruisse, of 7605 Manuel, stated there have been other incidents of vandalism and there is also potential criminal activity in a vacant house on Connecticut.
