Sheriff's Report:

Lt. Carter was unable to attend the meeting but did provide the Crime Report for January 2019 for the Trustees to review.

Fire/EMS Report: By Barry Cousino, Fire Chief

Chief Cousino reviewed the January Monthly Report and highlighted the following items:

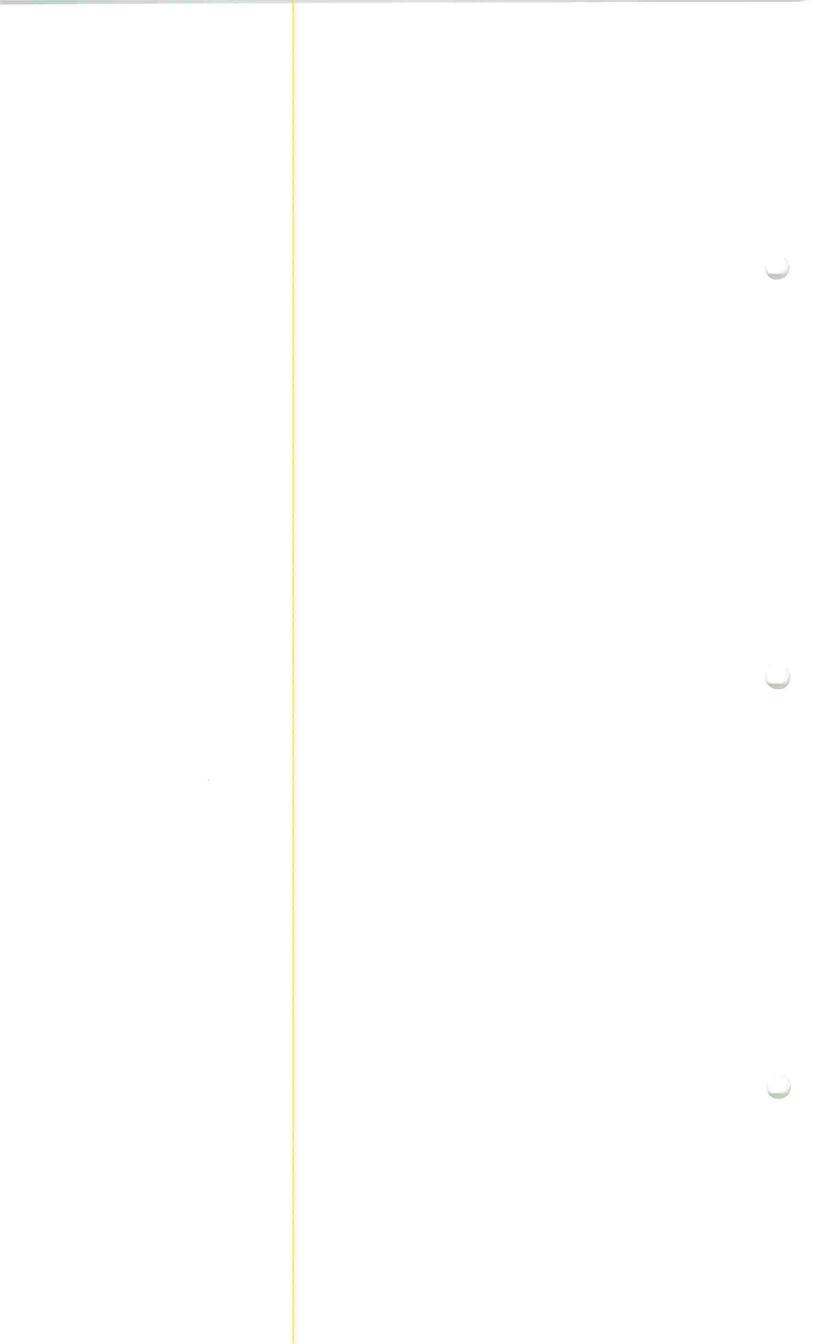
