Tom Anderson Jr. called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. All present were asked to rise for a silent prayer and the Pledge of Allegiance.

# **GUEST PRESENTATION:**

A conference call was convened between Laurie Manning and Bill Petro of Hylant Insurance, Legal Counsel, Gary Sommer, and the Trustee chambers, to allow the parties to discuss some ambiguities and apparent contradictions in the duty policy language. (See March 2, 2020 Trustee Meeting Minutes for summary of issues.) After considerable discussion, the Trustees asked Hylant to follow up on the issues raised by Legal Counsel, draft a policy that meets the ORC bonding requirements, but maintain bonds to cover the duty policy deductible. The appropriate Resolution to make the changes will be presented at the next Trustee meeting.

Sheriff's Report: By Lt. Leach

Lt. Leach was not present at the meeting but his monthly report was included in the packet.

#### PUBLIC SAFETY (cont.):

Fire/EMS Report: By Barry Cousino, Fire Chief

Chief Cousino reviewed the Monthly Report and highlighted the following items:

- Station 53 hosted Cub Scouts from Pack 236 who are earning their Hometown Heroes badge.
- Anna the Comfort Dog visited all of the Springfield Fire Stations and Administrative
  office
- A total of nine smoke detectors were installed within our district. The program is free to residents who have malfunctioning detectors or none at all.
- Fire department personnel attended Springfield Local School's kindergarten registration to sign up students for Safety Town.
- Bill Schultz was honored by TV13 as First Responder of the Week. Mr. Schultz works full time in the Roads Department and part time as Fire Fighter.
- Chief Cousino reported that Chief Helminski is acting as the point person on the Covid-19 pandemic. Any resident who believes they are infected are being evaluated by a single EMS, who can determine the proper course of action. The Department is also developing various scheduling and backup plans should the virus infect a significant portion of the Township's staff, or that of a neighboring Fire Department's staff.
- Fire/EMS responded to 240 calls in the month of February, of which 40 were in the Village of Holland, 24 in Spencer Township, 14 in Swanton Township, and 6 in Harding Township.

  the gate behind his building to avoid any further conflict with the neighbors. (See
  March 2, 2020 Trustee Meeting Minutes.) The Trustees asked Mr. Hampton to send
  him a letter of thanks and to also inform him that he must meet with a Township
  representative before reopening the gate.
- A Lucas County Community Development Strategy meeting is scheduled for 11:00 a.m. on Thursday, March 26<sup>th</sup>.

- In response to the Covid-19 pandemic, Mr. Hampton stated that the Township has
  cancelled all rentals through the month of April, established a visitor sign in sheet for
  the offices, purchased laptops for all office employees, and is working on a crisis pay
  policy. After discussing several options, the Trustees decided to maintain standard
  office hours for the time being.
- Mr. Hampton presented the Trustees with a mutual settlement agreement to finalize the Homecoming Park ballfield lighting project. The 2019 project experienced cost overruns due to the unusually wet spring and the relatively low lying parkland. The settlement will pay Lake Erie Electric \$53,786.80: \$17,800 for work itemized in the original contract, \$1,570.13 for change orders approved by the Administrator, \$10,000 for additional work approved by the Trustees, and \$24,416.16 for additional expenses incurred to complete the project.

Motion made by Robert Bethel to approve the agreement with Lake Erie Electric to settle the Homecoming Park lighting project, in the amount of \$53,786.80. Seconded by Andrew Glenn and the roll call resulted as follows:
