#### PUBLIC SAFETY:

Sheriff's Report: By Capt. Luettke & Lt. John Leach

Lt. John Leach said that the Sheriff's department has recently been emphasizing traffic stops. He also indicated that the speed trailer was currently down for maintenance but he would place any requests for its use on the waiting list. He also stated that there was no new activity to report on the Angola Road situation.

As requested, Capt. Luettke presented the JEDZ crime statistics from the past 4 years. The statistics show that overall calls have increased during that time but he also said that the presented data includes calls in the area, not just in the JEDZ zone. Going forward, Capt. Luettke said that he would change how the data was recorded to ensure that he could generate the requested statistics for 2019.

#### **PUBLIC SAFETY (cont.)**:

Fire/EMS Report: By Barry Cousino, Fire Chief

Chief Cousino reviewed the September Monthly Report and highlighted the following items:

<u>PUBLIC SERVICES:</u> By Andy Hohlbein, Director of Public Services Mr. Hohlbein reviewed the Monthly Report and highlighted the following items:

- Completed tree trimming on Devonshire.
- Preparing leaf collection equipment for the upcoming season.
- Repaired sidewalks in Wexford.

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- Attended an American with Disabilities seminar.
- Upgraded the landscaping in the roundabout at King and Nebraska to include stones and low maintenance shrubbery.
- The newest public services employees are working out well.
- The 2019 OPWC project in Lincoln Green neighborhood is running about two weeks behind schedule. The work is currently focusing on the curb pours.
- The Park Advisory Board meeting for October was cancelled.

Motion made by Andrew Glenn to contract with Oak Park Landscaping to maintain the pond/fountain in Homecoming Park, for an annual amount of \$3,000. Seconded by Tom Anderson Jr. and the roll call resulted as follows:

- Parcel maintenance was performed at 2413 Garden Creek, and 7347 Bancroft. In addition, a porch was removed at 308 Roseanna Dr.

#### **PUBLIC ADMINISTRATION:** By Mike Hampton, Administrator

Mr. Hampton reviewed the Public Administration's Monthly Report and highlighted the following items:

• As the Township delegate, Mr. Glenn reported on the 911 Consolidation meeting, which proposes to centralize all the county 911 calls through one center. Although Mr. Glenn indicated that he supports the approach, he was less confident that the details had been worked out and that the cost allocation would be fair. Specifically he questioned who would be charged for the calls from the government housing units and whether or not the small municipalities/townships would have the resources to pay for the services. Chief Cousino agreed with Trustee Glenn's overall assessment and indicated that the current proposal could potentially increase the Township's expenses by an additional \$60,000 to \$70,000 per year. Given that the funding details have not been worked out, the Trustees chose to withhold their support for the project at this time.

Motion made by Andrew Glenn to indicate support the 911 Consolidation proposal as described. Seconded by Tom Anderson Jr. and the roll call resulted as follows:

- The Mark Baller Construction Company from the Ohio Historical Preservation Society Office Barn List of contractors evaluated the Bicentennial barn and determined that it was beyond restoration. The Trustees asked Mr. Hampton to look at possibly recreating the artwork elsewhere in the Township.
- The Airport Highway side path has been added to the Transportation Alternatives Program application. The project, which involves constructing a non-motorized vehicle pathway and accesses on the Airport Highway/I-23 overpass, is estimated to cost \$771,102. The project is highly ranked because it would provide a safe walkway to Spring Meadows for those TARTA riders who get off at Airport Highway/Holland-Sylvania Road, as well as those students who attend Springfield schools but live on the east side of the interchange. If funded, the state would provide approximately 50% of the funding.

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Motion made by Tom Anderson Jr. to approve the Township's annual assessment for the Lucas Soil and Water Conservation District, in the amount of \$1,300, as presented. Seconded by Andrew Glenn and the roll call resulted as follows:
