PUBLIC SERVICES: By Andy Hohlbein, Director of Public Services

Mr. Hohlbein presented the Monthly Report and highlighted the following items:

- 250 tons of salt have been used since last month.
- Approximately ½ to ¾ of the Township tree trimming is complete.
- All of the Township's road berm and pothole repairs are complete for the moment.
- A Toledo Edison helicopter has been flying low over the area.
- The Township's road mileage has been increased and certified at 77 miles, due to more accurate measurement.
- The Lucas County SWU reimbursement has been received.
- Mr. Hohlbein is looking into refurbishing several leaf machines and will have estimates shortly.
- There were 3 burials, 4 graves sold, and 2 grave transfers last month.
- Routine repairs were completed on several fire vehicles.
- Several public hearing signs were posted or removed.
