The Springfield Township Trustees met in regular session, open to the public, on Tuesday, January 18, 2022, at 5:00 p.m. in the Township Chambers, 7617 Angola Road, Holland, Ohio with the following members present:

PUBLIC SAFETY:

Sheriff's Report: By Lt. John Leach

Lt. Leach presented the monthly statistics and said that the JEDZ holiday patrols responded to 81 incidents in 2021, versus 114 the prior year. He believed that widespread knowledge of the enhanced police presence in the area dissuaded criminal activity. He also said that there were two major incidents in the Township to report; a Felonious Assault and a shooting. The assault suspect is in custody and the victims are recovering but the police are looking for information regarding the shooting at the corner of Holland/Sylvania & Holland/Perrysburg.

Jerry Meyers of 406 Wilderness Trail, said that several catalytic converters have been stolen out of vehicles in his neighborhood at night and residents have reported a suspicious white truck driving around between midnight and 3:00 a.m., but deputies failed to respond to the calls. Lt Leach said that he would check on the status of the complaints but explained that officers are prioritized to the most severe incidents first, so may not be available to respond to all calls immediately. He also asked the neighborhood residents to forward any videos or license plate information they have to the Sheriff's Department.

PUBLIC SAFETY (cont.):

Fire/EMS Report: By John Ziehr, Battalion Chief

Chief Ziehr presented the Monthly Report and highlighted the following items:

- Resurgent COVID infections and exposures have decreased available staffing by 15-20%. Despite this, employees are accepting additional shifts and duties to ensure that response times remain at normal levels.
- The Department handled 4,992 runs in 2021, up from 4,375 runs in 2020.
- Chief Ziehr stated that fire department employees are especially grateful for the EAP services offered by the Township. Many Firefighters are utilizing the services to deal with the additional stresses and emotional losses inherent in their jobs.
- Fire/EMS responded to 439 calls in the month of December, of which 336 were in Springfield Township, 45 in the Village of Holland, 15 in Swanton Township, 27 in Spencer Township, 5 in Harding Township, and 11 in other mutual aid communities.

- Lucas County SWU has set a maximum annual reimbursement amount of \$90,000 for stormwater repairs, which are the responsibility of the County but completed by Township employees. The annual street sweeping contract is included in the cap.
- Only 72 tons of salt have been used so far this season.

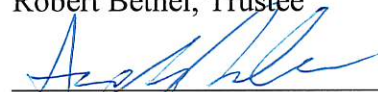
