The Springfield Township Trustees met in regular session, open to the public, on Tuesday, November 4, 2025, at 6:00 p.m. in the Township Chambers, 7617 Angola Road, Holland, Ohio with the following members present:

Rachel Geiger called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. All present were asked to rise for a silent prayer and the Pledge of Allegiance.

**PUBLIC COMMENTS:**

Matthew Fitzgibbons, 7519 Dorr St Toledo, OH 43615. Matthew discussed lighting concerns in Royal Village Mobile Home Park. He suggested the Township or Health Department conduct a new lighting survey, noting past deficiencies identified in a 2010 study. Township staff reported that the Department of Commerce recently reviewed the area and plans to request another light study. Matthew expressed appreciation for the Township's renewed involvement and noted that issues largely stem from park ownership rather than local management.

**GUEST PRESENTATION:** Community Homecoming Corporation

Rochelle Frank, President and Jim Hood, Treasurer of the Strawberry Festival, both from 802 Countway, Holland, 43528. Reported that this year's event was one of their most successful. They thanked the Springfield Township Sheriff's Office for their support and presented the Township with a \$4,000 donation. The proceeds benefit the Township's park fund and support community programs, including holiday assistance for families in need.

Public Hearing Clarification – Trustee Glenn clarified that the current public hearing did not concern the development on Airport Highway near Apple Blossom. That project is a permitted use and does not require a separate public hearing. The Board of Zoning Appeals (BZA) placed conditions on the development, and the trustees will review and approve the site plan once it meets those requirements. This item will appear on a future agenda, likely in December or January, at which time public comments will be accepted.

- Josh Hollinger, Zoning Inspector, 7617 Angola Road was sworn in by Rachel Geiger and presented a request to rezone 8511 Angola Road from RA-PUD to RA Suburban Residential District to allow development of a single-family subdivision. The Lucas County Planning Commission and Springfield Township Zoning Commission both recommended approval. The proposed use aligns with the Township Land Use Map for low- to medium-density residential development (2–6 units per acre) and is not expected to negatively impact surrounding areas. These will be single-family, not villas, and explained that the RA-PUD district allows reduced setbacks in exchange for open space, whereas the RA district maintains standard setback requirements. Trustees discussed the history of the development and reviewed photos of comparable home styles.
- Comments in Favor
  - Greg Feller of Feller Finch & Associates, 1683 Woodlands Drive, Maumee, OH spoke on behalf of the applicant, requesting rezoning of 8511 Angola Road from RA-PUD to RA Suburban Residential District. He explained that the property was originally developed as a PUD in the late 1990s, but the existing layout no longer meets current PUD open space requirements. The proposed development will better align with current zoning standards and maintain appropriate lot sizes without the need for PUD flexibility. Mr. Feller noted the proposed density is 2.3 units per acre, below the 3.2 units per acre allowed under the current PUD. An additional retention pond is planned to manage stormwater in compliance with modern regulations. The project is designed to be consistent and compatible with surrounding single-family homes. Mr. Feller explained that during detailed design, the plans will require review and approval by the County Engineer's Office, including all road, traffic, and layout details. A temporary turnaround will be required at the end of the street until any future road extension occurs. While a cul-de-sac would be less costly for the developer, the County Engineer's Office and Planning Commission are expected to require a stub street for potential future development. A temporary paved turnaround (not gravel) would meet county standards and remain in place unless the road is extended. Mr. Feller also noted that while the development will result in the loss of some trees, the land was originally intended for development, and efforts will be made to preserve as many trees as possible.
- Comments in Opposition
  - Andy Woodard, 8506 Aquaduct Park, Holland, OH. Mr. Woodard stated his opposition to the proposed development at 8511 Angola Road, citing concerns about smaller lot sizes compared to existing homes and the loss of mature trees that contribute to the neighborhood's character and environment. He encouraged the developer to consider an alternate location and leave the land undeveloped.
  - Anne and Franz Fulkerson, 8505 Aquaduct Park, Holland, OH. The Fulkerson's expressed their opposition to the proposed development at 8511 Angola Road. They stated the planned homes are not consistent with the architectural style or larger lot sizes of the existing Stone Ridge Farms neighborhood. They also raised concerns about increased traffic through limited access points on Pimlico Park and Pamshire Downs Court, potential safety issues for pedestrians and children, lack of school bus and emergency vehicle turnarounds, and the loss of mature trees.
  - John Ellert, 954 Pamshire Downs Court, Holland, OH. Mr. Ellert stated that he and some neighbors do not oppose the zoning change itself but expressed concerns about the proposed street layout. He highlighted issues with the dead-end street, noting difficulties for garbage trucks, school buses, emergency vehicles, and moving trucks. He suggested adding a temporary turnaround for

the last four lots until a future street connection is made to Saratoga and Derby Way.

- *Trustee comments* – the developer already holds approval to build under the existing PUD, which allows higher density and limited township oversight. The proposed change to RA zoning would reduce density, restrict development to single-family homes, and provide greater township protection. The developer confirmed homes would be 2,500–3,000 sq. ft. and valued over \$500,000.

- Fire and Rescue Operations Highlights
  - Battalion Chief Vascik along with Fire Chief Ziehr met with the Medical Director, Dr. Todd Brookens and EMS Administration from Maumee and Sylvania Fire Departments. Discussions centered around protocol updates and additional equipment and training needs as we move forward, continuing to lead the area with cutting-edge prehospital care.
  - Chief Ziehr was honored to be present at the Pathways to Public Service event hosted by TMACOG at Owens Community College. This great event explained to community members how to enter public service and highlighted the opportunities associated with public service.
- Public Relations
  - A citizen involved in a major crash visited crew members that helped save his life to thank them. The training, equipment and fast acting team were a direct result of this life saved per the trauma surgeon at UTMC. The family was extremely thankful, and the crew members were happy to get to meet this individual.
  - The 24<sup>th</sup> Annual Firefighter Memorial was held at Station 51. Two names were added this year making the roll call of eighty-eight members. This event was well attended, and we are extremely thankful to all of our community partners that help us to make this event possible annually.
  - Captain Kokocinski set up a static display and brought his antique fire apparatus to the Holland-Springfield Historical Societies open house. This event was a tribute to all of those who laid the foundation locally for the fire service. Captain Kokocinski is a wealth of knowledge with fire service history.

- Chamber update – ongoing leadership issues within the Holland Springfield Chamber. Due to internal disputes, there has been a lockout at the Chamber's building and Springfield Township has suspended participation until the organization resolves its direction and leadership matters. Township ribbon cuttings and related events will continue independently under the Springfield Township name and branding until further notice.
- Apple Blossom HOA meeting – attended the Apple Blossom HOA meeting to clarify the Township's authority regarding the Dollar General proposal and to explain the difference between the Township Board and the BZA. The discussion was well-received, though some residents are expected to attend future site plan reviews.
- Contractor interviews – Fire Station 51 Project – interviews were held with three contractors by the project team, including the Public Service Director, Fire Chief, Trustee Anderson, and architect Rich LeVeque. All interviews went well, and the RFP is being developed as design plans near 80–85% completion. Once proposals are received, the selection team will recommend a contractor to the Board. Noted that we have strong candidates and it was emphasized the importance of accurate estimates and open communication throughout the construction process.
